TCS: Meeting 2009 Shipping Challenges

Trenton Cold Storage Inc. (TCS) offers a temperature controlled freight consolidation program that is unparalleled in the Canadian distribution network, and never has this been more important to customers than it is today.

Through partnerships with key carriers, TCS provides coverage to all Canadian Provinces and Territories from Trenton, Ontario. Daily service is offered to most locations in Ontario and Quebec, with weekly service to Western and Eastern Canada, as well as exports into the United States. (62% of Canada's population is within 6 hours drive time of Trenton) In fact, the greater Toronto and Montreal areas can often be serviced at a lesser overall cost than storing inventory in those two centers. Each year, the TCS Freight Consolidation Program handles approximately 100 million pounds of freight. The company's

NOCS Completes Expansion, Looks Ahead

NOCS West Gulf in Houston, TX, proudly announces the opening of the company's 50,000 sq. ft. facility expansion, including 16 additional blast cells. It is NOCS' goal to strengthen its presence in the Gulf Coast region; this expansion makes the facility 140,000 sq. ft. This will also help the company expand ancillary services, such as transport and stevedoring, which, in turn, will make NOCS more available as a one-stop solution for customers.

New Facility, IT Strategy In the Works At Frialsa

Accellos

Frialsa wrapped up 2008 with new storage capacity in Cuautitlan (Mexico City Metropolitan Area). The 30,100 sq. ft. expansion offers 6,500 pallet positions with a SSI Schaefer mobile rack system, ideal in cities like Mexico City, where land is at a premium.

Frialsa is implementing a number of processes to become more efficient and customer oriented. Specifically, the company's information management systems are being re-aligned: a new ERP is being installed as well as an Accellos WMS; the latter will improve operations while empowering Frialsa's customers with enhanced visibility of their cold supply chain. Phase two includes new TMS and BI applications.

Great Lakes Looks To Green 2009

Great Lakes Cold Storage is targeting energy efficiency and conservation. Outdated warehouse lighting has been replaced with improved technology, such as motion sensor lighting in areas with little activity, resulting in lower kWh usage. These relighting efforts are equivalent to: 123 tons of coal not burned or, 49,315 trees planted or, 65 cars taken off the road or, 641,099 pounds of CO2 not released.

Energy Focus, Inc., a leader in lighting and solar solutions, awarded Great Lakes for "Greening the Planet", and offered thanks for improving the world we live. Great Lakes plans to continue its green effort by replacing dock doors and working with partners to improve and grow the company's consolidation programs, which save costs and energy.

American Cold Storage Strives For 2009 Improvements

American Cold Storage had a good 2008, opening a 6th warehouse in Tulsa, OK. The company also added a new blast freezer in Louisville, KY, and increased computer server capacity to handle future needs. This improvement will help the company in areas of customer service; a goal for 2009.



"We all are aware economic times are very difficult worldwide," said Bob DeRuyscher, Vice President Sales and Marketing. "But we believe our sales revenue can and will grow if we continue to improve our service through new technology. We see a need for additional blast freezing. We see a need for improved inventory control through RF scanning and EDI implementations. Finally, we see needs for possible contract warehousing with current customers."

The company expects 2009 to be a growth year in sales revenue, but operational costs will and must be contained. American Cold Storage will be implementing productivity standards to maintain and to improve its EBITDA performance. Productivity enhancements are expected to be one of our major initiatives in the coming year.
